Other countries can follow Bangladesh's experience on climate change



DHAKA, April 25, 2016 (BSS)- Other Least Developed countries (LDCs) can follow the country's experiences on adjusting the agriculture production with natural calamities and climate change as the country has achieved food sufficiency, said Senior Secretary of Industries Ministry M Mosharraf Hossain Bhuiyan today.

"Bangladesh has established itself as a country self-sufficient in food in the globe," he said while addressing as the chief guest at the inaugural session of a four-day international workshop on "Mainstreaming Climate Change Adaptation in Agriculture" at a city hotel, according to a release.

Asian Productivity Organisation (APO), Japan and National Productivity Organisation (NPO) under Industries Ministry jointly organised the workshop.

Mosahraff Hossain said the government has given top priority to all climate change related issues including agriculture in all sectors of development action plans.

Additional Secretary of Industries Ministry Sushen Chandra Das presided over the function.

A total of 22 representatives of 14 countries including Bangladesh are taking part in the workshop. Six experts from home and abroad are also participating.
