<b>Remarks</b>	This PIP supersedes the PIP issued on 18 January 2023 (Ref. No. 40) due to changes in the timing and venue from 28 March to 30 March 2023 in Kumarakom to 14 June to 16 June 2023 in Chennai. Participants selected prior to rescheduling of the conference will be issued new LAc based on their availability. The revised closing date is to invite additional nominations from all APO member countries.

<b>Objectives</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Commemorate the 60th anniversary of the APO and highlight contributions to cleaner industrialization and green growth.</li> <li>- Rejuvenate the productivity movement for achieving green growth.</li> <li>- Incorporate a focus on productivity enhancement in government policies and programs for increasing resource efficiency and energy productivity.</li> </ul>
<b>Rationale</b>	Due to overdependence on fossil fuel to meet energy needs and the existing “take–make–waste” model of industrialization, the world today faces a myriad of challenges including climate change, pollution, and environmental degradation. The COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated the situation. Hence, striving for economic growth and industrialization with the least environmental impact is imperative.
<b>Background</b>	COP26 adopted the Glasgow Climate Pact 2021 as part of efforts to limit the global temperature rise to 1.5°C. While it focused on mitigating emissions, adaptation to climate change, financing, and collaboration, the recently concluded COP27 reaffirmed commitments to limit the temperature rise. It went a step further through an agreement to provide “loss and damage” funding to countries facing adverse impacts of climate change. India assumed G20 presidency in 2023 with the motto of “One earth, One family, One future,” emphasizing the value of all life forms. This is in synergy with the government initiative known as Mission Lifestyle for Environment (LiFE) to create a cleaner, greener, bluer future launched in October 2022. For several decades, the APO has been conducting activities related to environmental protection. The Green Productivity (GP) concept developed by the APO provides industry a framework for simultaneous improvement of productivity, quality, and profitability with the least environmental impact.
